## Clinical Fellowship report

All my personal goals for the Clinical Fellowship 2014 at the Charité as the host clinic were achieved.

- 1. Knowledge of characteristic epidemiological and clinical features of skin allergic diseases, urticaria and angioedema in particular, in German population was obtained by attending:
  - urticaria consultations (with more than 200 patients with urticaria, angioedema, mastocytosis, autoinflammatory syndromes etc. observed, at least 20 hours spent by week);
  - grandrounds;
  - Journal club;
  - Research seminars;
  - and labmeetings.
- 2. Knowledge of skin allergic diseases and state-of-the-art methods of their diagnosis and treatment was expanded and deepened; and of novel approaches and techniques being introduced in our specialty, e.g.:
  - nuances of omalizumab treatment for various forms of CU;
  - the use of TempTest and FricTest devices as provocation tests in inducible urticaria;
  - new tools for assessing urticaria and angioedema activity and quality of life.
- 3. I learnt more about principles and peculiarities of dermatology and allergology practice in Germany and gained some clinical experience by:
  - attending allergic diseases consultations, especially urticaria and angioedema;
  - participating in Urticaria Day (1<sup>st</sup> of October 2014, Berlin, Germany), Bradykinin Symposium (15-16 October 2014, Berlin, Germany) and Charité/UNEV/icare/GA<sup>2</sup>LEN Angioedema School (16-17 October 2014, Berlin, Germany);
- 4. A good rapport and cooperation with German colleagues was established and a number of common projects have been planned or are already underway:
  - the design of a study on cyclosporine in the treatment of chronic spontaneous urticaria was developed;
  - two review articles on chronic spontaneous urticaria in rheumatic diseases were written and are currently being prepared for submission to international peer-reviewed journals;

- the application for DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) Grant was submitted.
- 5. I actively participated in EAACI's life during the time of Clinical Fellowship and gave an oral talk at the 3th Skin Allergy Club of the EAACI Dermatology Section (17-18.10.14, Zurich, Switzerland)
- 6. I became more familiar with the German language and culture and visited Berlin Museum of Medical History at the Charité.

**Conclusion:** the time I spent at Charite was an impressive experience that allowed me not only to improve my knowledge in clinical allergology but also to launch a research project and to prepare a number of papers on chronic urticaria. It definitely helped me better understand my future scientific and clinical goals. The role of this Fellowship in my career and self-development cannot be underestimated.
