



We look forward to meeting and working with you over the coming 3 days and continuing to collaborate with you in the future.



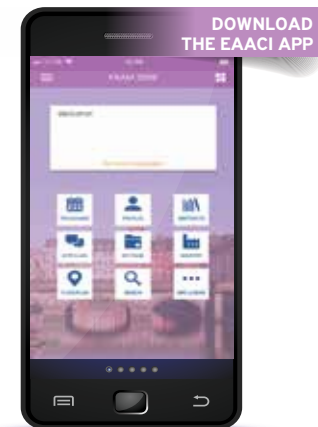

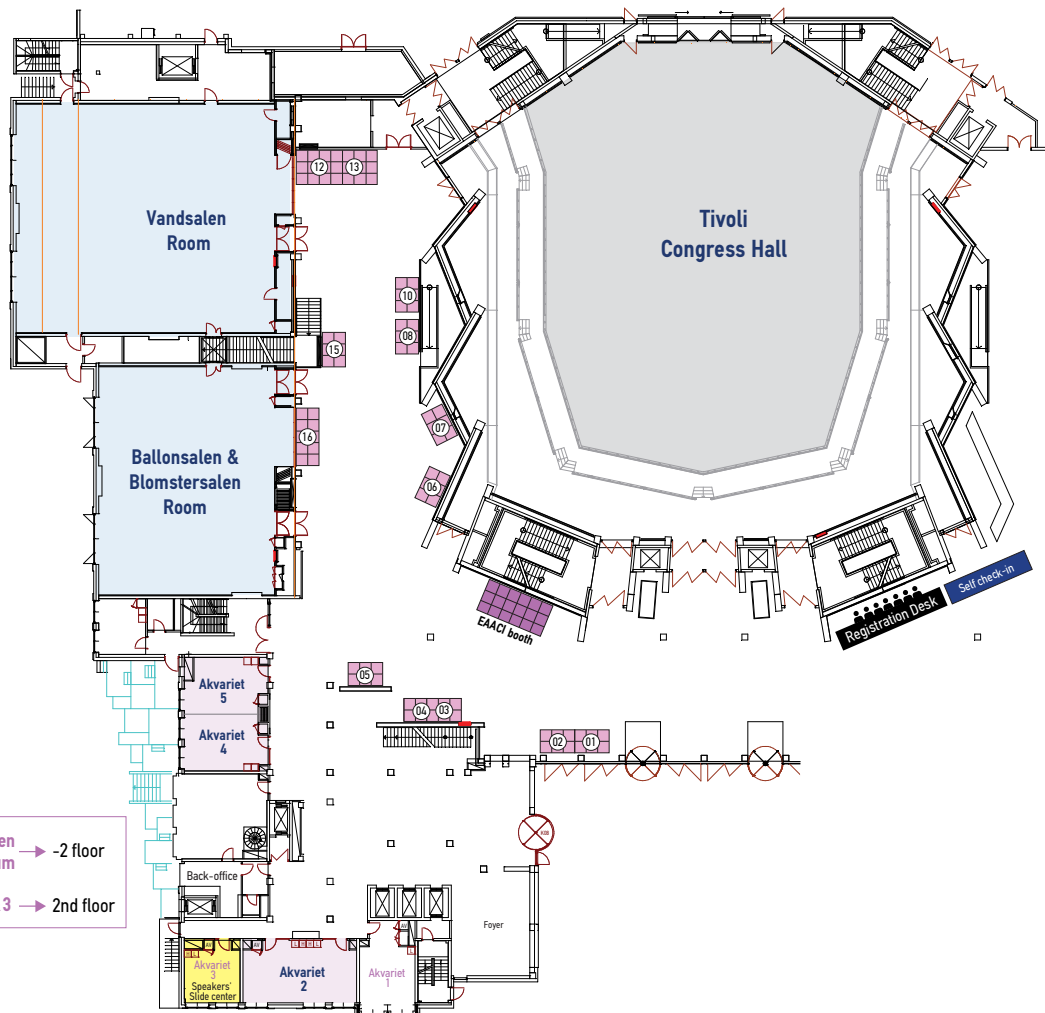
